"Nudging the Heart, to a New Start"

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There are "hints" of Jesus in the Old Testament, such as the "us" mentioned in Genesis 1:26 (confirmed in John 1:1-3 & Colossians 1:16), that He is the "active agent" of the creation of this earth. A. Jacob & Esau were an answer to Isaac's \_\_\_\_\_ (Gen 25:21). Esau discards birthright; Rebekah & Jacob connive for a blessing. 1) Does God abandon Jacob? He \_\_\_\_\_ him with a dream! 2) Genesis 28:12-15 records a dream of a ladder reaching heaven with angels ascending and descending. According to Jesus (in John 1:51), that ladder represents \_\_\_\_ (i.e., Himself). Jesus Christ is the connecting link between heaven and earth. 3) Jacob recognized that the \_\_\_\_\_ was there (Genesis 28:16). [B. June 2016: A Camp Meeting presentation called "Messiah's Method and Our Message: 'Rightly Dividing the Word of Truth.'" "And beginning at Moses and all the Prophets, He expounded to them in all the Scriptures the things concerning Himself' (Lk 24:27). Interpretation should be Christ-dependent, Chronological, Careful, Corporate, Comprehensive, Canonical, Contextual, Christ-centered.] C. POLYGAMY? 1) "In the beginning God gave to Adam \_\_\_\_\_ \_\_\_\_\_ – showing to all who should live upon the earth, his order and \_\_\_\_\_ in that respect" (Spiritual Gifts 3:63.1). 2) "Laws" & principles against polygamy are found in the Bible: Genesis 2:21-24; Leviticus 18:18; Deuteronomy 17:17; 1 Cor 7:1-4 3) "Even righteous men fell into the practice, and had a plurality of wives. Yet it was no less because they became corrupted, and departed in this thing from God's order" (Spirit of Prophecy 1:93.2). "Polygamy ... was no less a violation of the \_\_\_\_\_ of , and was fatal to the sacredness and peace of the family relation.... Abraham ... did not wait for God to fulfill His word in \_\_\_\_\_ own \_\_\_\_\_ and \_\_\_\_\_" (Patriarchs and Prophets 145.1). 4) "If God had sanctioned polygamy, He would not have thus directed Abraham to send away Hagar and her son. He would teach all a lesson in this" (Story of Redemption 80.2). God's way = best. Good news: God's grace \_\_\_\_\_\_ even those polygamists!

| D. Consider now some "deeper insights" about what transpired on       |
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| that night when Jacob wrestled with an assailant, unknown to him:     |
| 1) "All that made life dear to him [i.e., Jacob] were at a distance,  |
| exposed to danger and death With earnest cries and tears he           |
| made his prayer before God. Suddenly a strong hand was laid upon      |
| him The struggle continued until near the break of day, when          |
| the stranger placed his finger upon Jacob's thigh, and he was crip-   |
| pled instantly. The patriarch now discerned the character of his an-  |
| tagonist. He knew that he had been in conflict with a                 |
| messenger, and this was why his almost superhuman effort had not      |
| gained the victory. It was, 'the Angel of the covenant,'              |
| who had revealed Himself to Jacob All penitent and broken, he         |
| clung to the Angel; 'he wept, and made supplication' (Hosea 12:4),    |
| pleading for a He must have the assurance that his                    |
| sin was pardoned Jacob 'had power over the Angel, and pre-            |
| vailed.' Hosea 12:4. Through humiliation, repentance, and self-       |
| surrender, this sinful, erring mortal prevailed with the Majesty of   |
| heaven" (Patriarchs and Prophets, 196.3-7.1).                         |
| 2) "As an evidence that he had been forgiven, his name (Jacob, the    |
| 'deceiver') was changed from one that was a reminder of his sin, to   |
| one that commemorated his victory (Israel, a who has                  |
| [prevailed] with God)" (Patriarchs and Prophets, 197.2).              |
